Infrastructure and Learning Resources

4.1 Physical Facilities

4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc. (200 words)

The institution provides adequate infrastructure and physical facilities to support effective teaching-learning in accordance with the norms of the affiliating university and the academic needs of students. The college has a total built-up area of 17,818.56 sq. m. with 09 academic departments, 06 well-equipped classrooms, laboratories, a library, seminar hall, language laboratory, and 05 recognized research centres with Wi-Fi connectivity.

The ground floor houses the Administrative Office, Principal's Cabin, Seminar Hall, Staff Room, IQAC Office, Home Economics Laboratory, Music Room, Physical Education Laboratory, RO drinking water facility, gents' toilet, and a sanitary napkin vending machine. The first floor accommodates the Central Library, Departments of English, Hindi and History, two classrooms, Language Laboratory, NSS Office, and Competitive Examination Centre. The second floor comprises four classrooms, a Multipurpose Hall, Departments of Marathi and Sociology, boys' and girls' common rooms, and a storeroom.

The institution is equipped with 06 computers, 06 laptops, 04 LCD projectors, printers, scanners, UPS units, a biometric attendance system, reprography facilities, home theatre systems, and a generator, supported by a 100 Mbps internet connection. The campus is secured through 16 CCTV cameras, 1 smart board. The institution regularly upgrades its infrastructure and ICT facilities to enhance teaching, learning, research, and overall student development.

4.1.2 The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga etc. (200 words)

The institution provides adequate facilities to promote students' physical fitness, cultural development, and holistic personality development through sports, games, yoga, and cultural

activities. The college has a playground measuring 1,855 sq. m., which is regularly utilized for sports practices, competitions, and annual athletic events.

The Department of Physical Education is equipped with the necessary infrastructure and sports equipment for both indoor and outdoor games. Indoor facilities include Chess and Carrom, while outdoor facilities are available for Volleyball, Basketball, Kabaddi, Cricket, Badminton, and Hockey. The department also maintains sports equipment such as cricket kits, hockey sticks, basketballs, badminton sets, Lezim, and drums for regular practice and competitions. Yoga and meditation sessions are organized periodically to promote physical and mental well-being among students.

The college actively encourages students to participate in cultural programmes at institutional, university, and intercollegiate levels. The Cultural Unit is well equipped with musical instruments, including Harmonium, Tabala, Electronic Tanpura, and other accessories required for classical and modern performances. These facilities provide students with opportunities to nurture their artistic talents, preserve cultural heritage, develop leadership qualities, and enhance social awareness through various cultural and extension activities.

The institution provides adequate facilities for sports, cultural activities, yoga, and holistic student development.

4.2 Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The college library, spread over 110 sq. m. (1,184 sq. ft.), functions as an important knowledge resource centre supporting teaching, learning, and research. It follows an open access system, enabling students and faculty to access library resources conveniently.

The library is partially automated using the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) software E-Vidya (Version 1.0), which has been in use since 2020. A dedicated computer with Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) facility enables users to search the library collection efficiently.

The library houses 3,014 text and reference books covering 1,341 titles. It also preserves rare books and manuscripts, enriching its academic resources. To facilitate digital learning, the library is equipped with 06 laptops, 02 desktop computers, and a 100 Mbps internet connection, all accessible to students and staff free of cost. Reprography services are also available.

The library holds an active membership of the INFLIBNET N-LIST consortium, providing access to more than 6,000 e-journals and 3,35,000 e-books across various disciplines. To enhance resource sharing, the institution has signed MoUs with the Government District Library, Yavatmal, and the Knowledge Resource Centre of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati.

4.3IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The institution has established a systematic mechanism for upgrading and maintaining its Information Technology (IT) infrastructure to support effective teaching-learning, administration, and research. IT requirements are periodically assessed based on the needs of students, faculty, administrative staff, and other stakeholders.

The college has 06 computers and 06 laptops equipped with updated software and internet connectivity. The campus is enabled with Wi-Fi, providing internet access to students and staff. A 100 Mbps broadband connection ensures uninterrupted digital services, including a dedicated 100 Mbps internet connection for the library introduced on 31 March 2021 to strengthen access to digital learning resources.

ICT-enabled teaching is facilitated through 06 LCD projectors installed in classrooms, supported by adequate furniture and modern teaching aids. The library offers access to thousands of e-journals and e-books through the INFLIBNET N-LIST consortium.

The Language Laboratory is equipped with **01 printer, 05 headphones, and 01 home theatre system** to support language learning. The administrative office is partially automated with updated software, printers, photocopiers, and ICT tools for efficient office management. The entire campus is monitored through a CCTV surveillance system, ensuring safety.

The institution continuously upgrades its IT infrastructure to promote digital learning, efficient governance, and quality education.

4.4.2 There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The institution has established a well-defined system for the maintenance and optimum utilization of its physical, academic, and support facilities to ensure a conducive environment for teaching, learning, research, and co-curricular activities. The maintenance process is monitored through statutory and administrative committees, including the College Development Committee (CDC), Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Staff Council, Purchase Committee, Building Committee, Stock Verification Committee, Library Advisory Committee, and Sports Committee.

The committees periodically assess infrastructure requirements, prepare proposals for maintenance and procurement, and submit recommendations to the Principal. Regular stock verification and preventive maintenance ensure effective utilization of institutional resources.

The Library Advisory Committee oversees the modernization of library services, preparation of the annual budget, procurement of books, journals, periodicals, and other learning resources, and the functioning of the partially automated library.

The Sports Committee supervises the maintenance and utilization of sports facilities and equipment. The institution also maintains Home Economics and Music laboratories, ensuring timely procurement of equipment and consumables.

Routine maintenance of classrooms, computers, ICT facilities, furniture, and campus infrastructure is undertaken during the vacation period to ensure uninterrupted academic activities and a learner-friendly environment throughout the year.
